

Choose the base animal for your chimera. Here I chose a lion and found a good quality image with a background that is easy to remove.



Copy and paste it into a new Photoshop file 11 x 8.5"
Edit > Transform > Scale make it so you can see the background to delete
Use the magic wand or direct selection tool to select the background.
Press backspace/ delete to erase it






Choose an animal for the back half. Find one that is as close to the same position as your base animal. Remember you can always flip and rotate it as needed in photoshop to fit.




Edit > Transform > Scale
Make it smaller.



For busier backgrounds, you can use the eraser tool to erase it out. Be careful around the edges of the animal. You can adjust the eraser like a brush with the size of it and the opacity of it.




Again, you can adjust everything about the eraser.



Erase out what you don't need from the animal.

Notice I have turned off the lion layer. (click the eye)

This makes it easier to focus on erasing the goat cleanly so I don't miss anything.




Flip the animal part if needed.

Edit > Transform > Flip Horizontal (or whatever direction you need for your chimera)



Edit > Transform
Rotate from the corners.



You can also warp it to fit!
Edit > Transform > Warp



Click and drag the points until they fit nicely.
Don't forget to use your eraser at a low opacity to soften the edge where
the two animals combine



You can also click and drag the layers around on top or under one another for the best fit





You need AT LEAST 3 animal parts together to form your chimera.
Think two for the main body, a head, maybe wings, horns, tail etc.





Now, say you bring in wings, but you need one wing in the back and one in the front. Use the lasso tool and draw a circle around what you want to move. Press control > J This will copy that selection and put it on a new layer.



Then erase the wing you don't need.



Move it where it needs to go. Remember you can adjust the layer order!



Once you are happy with your chimera, hold down shift and click on each animal part layer. Then click the button with the 4 lines. Then click Merge Layers.

This allows you to move your chimera as one image and edit it as one image.






Now, search for a background image. Landscapes work well but make sure there is a space for the chimera to stand. Really think about where your chimera could live or exist.




Choose the chimera and Edit > Transform > Perspective
Pull from the corners to make the chimera appear like it is standing in the space right.




Edit your background image to make your chimera stand out.
Use the “burn” tool to add a shadow under your chimera.
Make sure your background layer is selected.
Add a filter. Filter > Filter Gallery



Choose a filter that works with your chimera. We want it be slightly blurry so the chimera stands out.



Merge the chimera layer and the background like you merged the chimera parts together



You may need to adjust the brightness and contrast once you merge the two layers.
